# BUSINESS POLICIES/INFORMED CONSENT- PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

### Therapist Training & Experience / Limitations of Massage Therapy

In 2008 I completed a minimum of 500 hours of massage training from a National approved school located in VT and passed the certification requirements. My initial training included: Swedish massage, deep-tissue and shiatsu. After graduation I continued further training techniques to include Cranial Sacral, Thai massage (this style includes stretching and light compression), Hot Stones, Myofascial Release, Sound Therapy, Reiki with my completion of the National Board Certified Massage Therapy in 2012. I completed my Professional Bowen Therapy training in 2018 and have continued studies in different modalities of Bowen Therapy. My current studies are in Emmett Therapy. Massage therapists do not diagnose medical diseases or musculoskeletal conditions. Massage therapy is not a substitute for medical examination and or treatment. Massage therapists do not prescribe herbs or drugs, including aspirin or ibuprofen, or medical treatments. They do not perform spinal adjustments and they cannot counsel clients about emotional or spiritual issues as would be provided by a mental health professional or spiritual leader. If you experience symptoms that lead you to believe you may have a medical condition, it is recommended that you visit a physician for diagnosis and treatment.

#### **Expectations and Rights**

The client is expected to demonstrate good hygiene and not use illegal drugs or alcohol before the session (the use of drugs and alcohol make it unsafe for a client to receive massage). Clients and therapists are expected to refrain from any behavior of a sexual nature, including sexual jokes, nicknames, or immodest conduct. Sexual behavior from the therapist toward a client may lead to a formal complaint filed with the state board of massage. This may lead to the loss of the therapist's certification. Sexual behavior from the client toward the therapist is inappropriate and will lead to the termination of the session and refusal of further service. The client has a right to prompt, professional service in an environment that is clean, private, and safe. Client information is not shared with any members of the public or other health-care providers unless the client releases the information in writing. A court of law may order the client's health-care records released to the court as part of a legal proceeding. Therapists are obligated to report information about the abuse of a child, elderly person, or mentally or physically challenged person in the event that such information is related during the session.

Therapists are obligated to report threats of self-harm, or threats that the client plans to harm another person, to authorities. The client has the right to end the session at any time should they feel dissatisfied or uncomfortable with the session in any way. ## Your Massage Session and Adverse Massage Reactions

Massage may lead to adverse reactions in certain situations or when used with certain conditions or medications. After you complete the health intake form, I will evaluate your health-history intake and I may ask questions to ensure that it is safe for you to receive massage. In the event that I feel uncertain that massage will be of benefit to you, I may ask you to provide a note from your physician stating that it is safe for you to receive massage. Please provide complete details of medical conditions and medications on the health-intake interview. Failure to inform me of all medical conditions and medications may place you at increased risk for adverse reactions. After we complete the interview process, I will take you to a private treatment room, review the form with you, and discuss your goals for the session. I will customize the massage to meet your specific needs within the limits of my training and scope of practice. I will then

I will then leave the room while you undress and position yourself under the drape on the massage table. Only the area being massaged at the time is undraped as the session proceeds. The breasts, genitals, and anus are never undraped during a session, and every effort is made to respect and protect both the client's and therapist's modesty. You may leave on your underclothing if you prefer. I will ask you a few questions—for instance, about the comfort of the stroke pressure, room temperature, or choice of session music—and you should let me know immediately if you are not comfortable.

# Business Policies and Practices- 24 HOUR CANCELLATION POLICY!

You may book a 60 or 90 minute massage session online at <a href="www.branchesofwellness.fullslate.com">www.branchesofwellness.fullslate.com</a> I accept cash, personal checks, and all major credit cards, Paypal or Venmo. At the time of booking, I do not require a valid/current Credit Card to be on file for late cancellations. Clients arriving late will still be charged for the full session time booked and the session will end promptly at the scheduled time. Clients must cancel sessions with 24 hours notice or pay the \$40 late cancellation fee, appointments cancelled within 3 hours will be charged the full cost of the session. Returned checks will be charged a \$20 processing fee. I do not bill medical insurance companies for services, I do however bill for workmen's compensation or auto insurance injuries. For new guests needing to complete health form/consent at the center, plan to arrive at least 15 minutes before your start time. Business hours are Monday 9:00am to 12:00 pm, Tuesday-Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. I am located at 4 Kellogg Road, Essex Jct. Children and teens are welcome, but an adult guardian must be present with those under the age of 15 in the treatment room throughout the session.
